



Outdoor Education Adventures Volunteer Educator Position & Field Trip Description

Outdoor Education Adventures' (OEA) Field Trips provide students in grade kindergarten through high school with a hands-on, educational experience which encourages investigation and discovery with the natural world. Students engage in a variety of activities which provide kids with a sense of place, increase scientific and environmental literacy, strengthen critical thinking skills, and present opportunities for nature connect. Lesson topics may include watershed geography, local ecology and natural history, animal and plant identification, habitats and adaptations, and more. Training, resources, and materials will be provided.

Position Description

Volunteer educators lead groups of approximately 10-15 students through fun, hands-on activities while gaining valuable experience working with children and teaching environmental education in an outdoor setting.

Field Trip Locations

Field trips take place in a variety of locations throughout Yamhill County, including public parks and natural areas, privately owned properties, and vineyards. All field trips are outdoors in all, except hazardous, weather conditions.

Typical Field Trip Schedule

- Field trips usually take place during the school day between 9:00am-2:00pm. They can range from a two to five hour field experience.
 - Educators are asked to arrive 30-45 minutes before students.
- Students rotate between stations which are typically around 30 minutes long.

Funds for a small stipend may be available
